Confessions and Forgiveness

All may make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at baptism, as the minister begins P: Blessed be the Holy One of Israel, the Word made flesh, the Power of the Most High, + one God, now and forever. **C: Amen.**

P: Let us come into the light of Christ, confessing our need for God's mercy.

Silence is kept for reflection.

C: Gracious God, in Christ Jesus you come among us as light shining in darkness. We confess our failure to welcome this light. Forgive us and renew our hope, so that we may live in the light of your grace, and welcome the truth of Christ the Lord. Amen.

P: In the Word who has come to dwell with us, God has given us grace upon grace: forgiveness that is stronger than our sins, love that can heal every broken heart. Hear this word of God's pardon and peace: in the name of + Jesus our Savior, you are free from all your sins. Rise, shine, for your light has come. **C: Amen.**

P: The Lord himself will give you a sign: the virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel.

C: Blessed is the day of grace, when God sent a Son.

P: Blessed is Mary, to bear such a child. Blessed is Joseph, to care for him on Earth.

C: Blessed are we, to know him in our hearts.

P: He comes to us quietly, with little fanfare.

C: Softly, as in a whisper, God sends salvation to this fallen world.

P: Into the quiet of the long night the Light of the world flickers into human life, a spark which will engulf the world.

C: Come, little Lord Jesus, and be our guest. Stay with us; live with us; be with us, forever. Amen.

C: Almighty God, you made this holy day shine with the brightness of the true Light. Grant that here on earth we may walk in the light of Jesus' presence and in the last day wake to the brightness of his glory; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Second Reading

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered.² This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria.³ All went to their own towns to be registered. ⁴ Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. ⁵ He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. ⁶ While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. ⁷ And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.
