### <u>Luke 4:21-30</u>

<sup>21</sup>Then he began to say to them, "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." <sup>22</sup>All spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth. They said, "Is not this Joseph's son?" <sup>23</sup>He said to them, "Doubtless you will quote to me this proverb, 'Doctor, cure yourself!' And you will say, 'Do here also in your hometown the things that we have heard you did at Capernaum." <sup>24</sup>And he said, "Truly I tell you, no prophet is accepted in the prophet's hometown. <sup>25</sup>But the truth is, there were many widows in Israel in the time of Elijah, when the heaven was shut up three years and six months, and there was a severe famine over all the land; <sup>26</sup>yet Elijah was sent to none of them except to a widow at Zarephath in Sidon. <sup>27</sup>There were also many lepers in Israel in the time of the prophet et Elisha, and none of them was cleansed except Naaman the Syrian." <sup>28</sup>When they heard this, all in the synagogue were filled with rage. <sup>29</sup>They got up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town was built, so that they might hurl him off the cliff. <sup>30</sup>But he passed through the midst of them and went on his way.

Lent is coming, when once again we will embark on our Lenten journey of repentance and new life. We hope our journey ends well, but what if Jesus were to show up and mess up our neat plans? ### <u>Prayer</u>





Upcoming in March: Ash Wednesday March 2nd, and weekly Wednesday Services after that.



The origins of Lent were that one was to leave their old life behind to fast and prepare to be baptized into a new way of living. In essence, this was a practice of stepping away from corrupt power, scarcity mentality, and empty rituals in order to live a more expansive and full life of faith. And so, our Lenten theme, Full to the Brim, is an invitation—into a radically different Lent, into a full life. It's an invitation to be authentically who you are, to counter scarcity and injustice at every turn, to pour out even more grace wherever it is needed. When we allow ourselves to be filled to the brim with God's lavish love, that love spills over. It reaches beyond ourselves; like water, it rushes and flows, touching everything in its path. As we journey through the season of Lent, we will find

scriptures, poems, art, reflections, and hymns that are filled with promises of God's abundant and expansive grace. Some of the stories you will encounter include: Jesus as a mother hen, a prodigal son welcomed home, a fig tree nurtured with care and hope, precious oil poured out lovingly and freely, and stones shouting out with praise. These sacred texts are brimming with a gospel of grace. We've done nothing to deserve or earn this grace, and yet, like water, it spills over. Full to the Brim reminds us to live fully—as we pursue justice and hope, or express grief and gratitude. And so, this Lent, let us trust—fully—that we belong to God. Let us increase our capacity to receive and give grace. Let us discover the expansive life God dreams for us. (A Sanctified Art LLC)

Synod Assembly is being changed to 6/4&5/2022: Items to be added to Agenda, Indy – need to discuss backfill options, Updating Library, Mission Statement, Mission Support. Adoption of the Agenda, Moved to Approve Agenda Barb Melroe Second Sheridan McKeever MC<u>Yes</u>: SECRETARY'S REPORT: Moved to Approve Minutes<u>Courtney Anderson</u> Second <u>Mike Larson</u> MC<u>Yes</u> CHURCH GROUP REPORTS: Property and Grounds – heat tape needs to be replaced, Grotberg is moving GFI to one of the columns and out of the soffits to the breaker box and in the furnace room. Mike Larson looking at installing Copper chucks for sewage vent to prevent freezing - Paul White Moved to approve and Martin Potts second – Motion Carried. Snow removal from parking lot – proceeding as usual. WELCA – Served Gelene Hemminger funeral and cider for live nativity, Men's Group – Oysters for annual meeting have arrived for 1/30/2022 at 5pm, YOGA – Did Poinsette sale, soup and sandwich action – Rachel has total count; less than previous year auction was held. Rachel is working on registration for Minneapolis trip deadline coming up 1/21/2022. Education – Set last date for Sunday School is 5/8/2022. Still looking for someone to volunteer for Sunday School Superintendent. Altar Guild – Candles in sconces have been replaced and look great! Christmas decorations have been taken down. Figuring out which paraments to order. Worship and Music – Met on Sunday, 1/9/2022, to pick out music for Lent. Looking to have more interaction with possible Choir. Need to determine if we will have Potluck for Lent season. Indy's replacement - will most likely be out for quite some time. Jamie has reached out to see if there is anything we can assist with. Jamie talked to Becky, she may help with some recordings, but realize we need to be open and understand there may be some services where we do not have music. May try doing recorded music or have band class play a song or two during service. Funeral we may need to reach out – funeral homes are generally good about providing music. For Lent services we maybe only have recorded music. Drive Thru – signs are ordered, Mike will get holes drilled and prepped for signed to be installed. Covid 19 – Will continue to monitor numbers and determine if we need to update. OLD BUSINESS: Reminders – not sure who is doing, Rental/Event calendar – leave in the office, Removal of table in narthex – pamphlet holders here, and need to be installed, Stuff in pews – confirmations kids did put paper and pens in, Wireless mics – ordered, seeing if Austin or Shawn can install. TV screen for Jaime to see - ordere Signs for drive thru. NEW BUSINESS: Basement at the parsonage – Jessica called a company to look at it and they will be here on January 18th, Ricks jobs list – Do we need to look at having work groups to assist? Or possibly a day to divide the areas up and get everything cleaned. Paul White will bring up to Men's group to do floors in Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall. Insulation needs to be installed. Need to discuss having it hired done; going to reach out to Austin Creech or Comstock gave a number for Cullins to possibly assist. Need to get insulation done within the next month. Jamie would like to have Mission Statement added; Jamie has Julie Waswick working on some different logos, for letter head, attire, etc. Would like to get mission statement reviewed prior to Annual Meeting for congregation's review. Committee for member list; trying to create this as more of a dialogue for updated directory. Committee for events held at the church - funerals (lunch pricing, etc.), weddings (fees for use, pianist, pastor, what is expected of renter, etc.) Determine if there's a deposit fee. Fee for Members/Non-Members. Kirstin Kempel and Nancy Wrage are planning on heading up a Wedding Coordinator Committee. Increase for Secretary Salary - Kris is going to talk to Carilli. Updating the Library - need to do new flooring, furniture, some paint, updating artwork. Being YOGA's domain would like to have their help with updates, physically and monetarily. Wedding planned for 6/18 - Library tends to be used for weddings so trying to keep that date in mind. Books, miscellaneous items will be looked at and then listed in newsletter for anyone wanting those items. Letter from Jessica Miller – She is asking for prayers for their ministry as they supply a lot of food to individuals in their area, and if our congregation would be willing to pledge, asking for pledges ranging from \$500-\$5,000.
