"God Pause"

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year! "For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven." – Ecclesiastes 3:1.

We write this letter to you on the cusp of Christmas Eve with anticipation and hope that you are filled with peace, hope, joy, and love that comes from our dear Savior's birth. The season of Advent, the season of waiting and anticipation for our Christ Jesus to be born unto us, is coming to a close and we are soon to enter the season of Christmas, a time of great joy as we remember that our God, Emmanuel, has come to dwell with us. Even though the seasons change, our God remains constant. For everything there is a season, and that includes the many seasons of life we experience together at GA Church. In 2025, we have known seasons of laughter and dancing, of building one another up, and of planting and bringing new ideas to life—discovering new ways of being church together, both within and beyond the four walls: We are building people up together as we support our high school students to lead Sunday school and invite our young children to help with Holy Communion. We laughed and danced and birthed new ways of being church together with our Christmas Pageant, "Mary Said Yes," on December 14th. We modeled together what it looks like to say YES and participate in God's story (and worship service) as the entire congregation took part in the pageant. We have mentors working with confirmation students to implement service projects throughout the community and beyond. These projects are building up our youth's faith and leadership, and teaching them how to live out their baptisms. This last year we have also experienced times of mourning, dying, breaking down, losing, and weeping: the death of loved ones. Acknowledging the end of GA Church's Lutefisk Supper, new and chronic illnesses of community members, financial strain for our community members and church. Even though the seasons of our faith community at GA Church change, our God remains constant.

As the seasons continue to change, we write this letter to you as a reminder that Pastor Jaime's role at GA Church is also changing beginning January 1, 2026. GA Church will be going through a season of change as Pastor Jaime goes down to 75% time as our pastor. As a result of this change, Pastor Jaime will be leading less worship services throughout the year and letting go of more responsibilities. This decision was voted on and passed at our 2025 annual congregational meeting last March. Over the past few years, as an act of faithful stewardship and shared responsibility for the financial health of GA Church, we have together discerned the decision to reduce Pastor Jaime's contracted time in place of increasing her salary. It is our hope that GA Church will not only survive the seasons ahead, but we will thrive and continue to be a place and community that risks big things for good things in order to serve our community and ever-changing world.

In the midst of this change, Pastor Jaime's priorities as our pastor will include praying for God's people, nourishing them with word and sacraments, and leading them by her own example in faithful service and holy living. Pastor Jaime will continue to work alongside the council to find a resolution to our roof problem, practice faithful stewardship, and create spaces of belonging.

We know that change is oftentimes difficult. So, in order to make this change easier for our faith community, Pastor Jaime is planning to be non-contracted the first Sunday of every month, when possible, and during slower seasons of the church year. We are also working with a few SAMs (Synod Authorized Ministers) from Sargent County to lead worship services on a consistent basis during those times Pastor Jaime is non-contracted. As usual, if you have a pastoral emergency during the weeks when Pastor Jaime is not available, please contact Kirstin Kempel, council president, or Carrili Larson, church secretary, and they will help you get in contact with a pastor.

Drawing from Ecclesiastes 3:1-8, we are reminded that for everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven. In this season of change in our faith community, we recognize the holy rhythms named in scripture: a time to be born and a time to die; a time to plant and a time to pluck up what is planted; a time to break down and a time to build up; a time to weep and a time to laugh; a time to mourn and a time to dance. In every season and every matter, we trust in the Christmas promise that God is with us.

We invite you to check the weekly announcements, monthly newsletter, and our website, galutheranchurch.org, to keep informed of changes and/or Pastor Jaime's schedule. We ask that you offer grace in this season of change as it will be an adjustment for us all. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact us. Council Meeting Minutes 12/14/25: Written by Walter Wrage

Members present: Kirstin, Mike, Walter, Martin

Meeting called to order: Pres. Kirstin called meeting to order at 5:36pm

Devotions and Prayer:

Adopt the agenda: Kirstin added christmas gift discussion and staff hours adjustment for Carrili. Discussion was held on 2026 compensation and benefits for Pastor Jaime as she moves to 75% call beginning January 1st. Mike made a motion to adopt the new agenda. Martin seconded the motion.

Pastor Jaime joined the meeting after the discussion at 6:10 pm.

Secretary Report: Walter made a motion to approve sec. report, Martin seconded the motion.

Paster Report: -It was confirmed that we met the minimum intent card to initiate the anonymous donor contributions. -Jaime updated us on the grant submission through Church Anew. Nov. 16: Funeral for Ginger and Rodney Utecht Nov. 14-16: Meta Herrick Carlson, my coach and leadership consultant from Church Anew's Renewing Reformation Program, was in Gwinner and joined in conversation with community members, as well as led us in singing our Peace on the Prairie worship service Sunday, November 16. Nov. 23 - last day of SS for fall session Nov. 28: met with Scott Searl, stewardship consultant from Church Anew, to show him around our church and community of Gwinner, and have discussion around possibilities, challenges, and opportunities in GA and Gwinner. Nov. 30 - Advent Season starts. This year's theme is "The Power of Yes" through Church Anew resource. December 2-8: vacation December 11: Ruth Circle in Lisbon at hospital nursing home; confirmation lock-in December 11: started a four week Advent devotion in place of book study December 14: drew names for Blue Camel Gift Exchange - had 21 people/families that participated Dec. 16: had eval with Kirstin and Lori; Multi-community Cantata at GA Christmas Eve traditional service will be at 4pm. No service on Christmas Day.

Work group reports

<u>Property and grounds:</u> -Walter added sensors in the attic for temperature and humidity monitoring. -The heat tape is plugged in on the roof. -We need to check on the sump pump at the parsonage. -The parking lot light has been fixed by Ottertail, the city covered the cost. -Need to scoop the snow from in front of the Sunday school exit door, Martin will take care of it. -Walter brought up winter time overnight parking.

Welca: 2 bake sales, the leftovers will be donated. Successful sales with good turnout.

Mens Group: no update.

Yoga: Confirmation class had a lock-in, Soup and sandwich and auction was held after worship on December 14th. Raised over \$1200. New leaders Mason Stahl, Caleb Adams.

Education: -Need to decide an end date for the make a change offering. Also need to choose a date for picking gifts to donate. **Alter Guild:** Christmas season, poinsettia fundraiser. Worship and Music: Meeting in January, Lent season will be decided at that point.

<u>Old Business:</u> -Financials will be posted in the bulletin every month. Will be doing financial reports and sending out twice a year. Will be sending a thank you letter for people who have given.

New Business: communion served by SAMs. "They" have training to give communion. The council president will have to email the synod for authorization for SAMs to preside at GA Church at least 10 days before the Sunday they will be leading.

- <u>-Constitution:</u> Meta Herrick Carlson, leadership consultant and coach through Church Anew, and Pastor Jaime went through the constitution and found we do not need to have two separate congregational meetings nor two votes to make changes to the constitution. We only need to have the meeting date and info for the vote/meeting to be announced on the two consecutive Sundays before the date of the congregational meeting.
- -Will not be adding a section on family members on council who can't be immediate family members of paid staff. -Discussion on the pastor as the person in charge of the paid staff. Will not be adding this provision. This would be open to reconsider this in the future.
- -Pastor contract for next year, will be giving the congregation options in the annual meeting. Discussed at length for payment, benefits, vacation, etc.
- -Parking lot light fixed.
- -Process for getting replacement members for council.

Treasure's Report: -51 intent cards came in. -discussed lay-pastor pay. -Balance as of today: \$25,379.59

Mike made a motion to approve, Martin seconded. Adjournment: 7:10pm
