"God Pause"

HEBREWS 13:1-8, 15-16 (NRSV)

Let mutual love continue. Verse²Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it. Verse³Remember those who are in prison, as though you were in prison with them; those who are being tortured, as though you yourselves were being tortured. Verse⁴Let marriage be held in honor by all, and let the marriage bed be kept undefiled; for God will judge fornicators and adulterers. Verse⁵Keep your lives free from the love of money, and be content with what you have; for he has said, "I will never leave you or forsake you." Verse⁶So we can say with confidence, "The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can anyone do to me?" Verse⁷Remember your leaders, those who spoke the word of God to you; consider the outcome of their way of life, and imitate their faith. Verse⁸Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever. Verse¹⁵Through him, then, let us continually offer a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that confess his name. Verse¹⁶Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.

DEVOTION

Similar to yesterday's psalm, this passage begins with a series of guidelines for faithful living. Jesus' followers are to love one another, welcome strangers, visit prisoners, be faithful in marriage, be content with their financial resources, and finally remember and imitate their past leaders. While this list challenges and inspires us, it is God's attendant promise that gives us strength. Each time we fall short, we remember that God has told us: "I will never leave you or forsake you." We are able to share mutual affection with one another because we know that God is continually sharing that love with us. Yesterday, today, and forever will be just enough time to begin to appreciate the vastness of God's love for all humanity. Yesterday, today, and forever we are invited to praise the God whose name we confess, and honor God through lives well-lived.

Congregational Meeting: Attention: Congregational Meeting on October 12th, 2025 to discuss replacing the roof. The GA Church roof has been leaking water for a few years in various areas of the church. Along with the Sunday School rooms and the kitchen, we are now experiencing leaks in the Fellowship Hall and above the southeast sanctuary door. After checking with various roofing companies, the GA Church council invites all members to a congregational meeting following the church service on October 12th. At this meeting, we will discuss the possibility of replacing the church roof and the necessary funding to pay for it. This is a substantial, but necessary undertaking if we want to prevent further damage to the church building. For over 100 years, GA has served as an integral place in Gwinner for people to gather to worship, fellowship, learn, serve, and grow. It is our hope that you will join us on October 12th to help us decide how we can best serve our church and our community.

Food Pantry: The Gwinner location of the Sargent County Food Pantry Ongoing Needs: Any shelf-stable, non-perishable Items are needed. Suggested items: Canned items (vegetables, fruit, meat -tuna or chicken, beans, soup), ready-meals (hamburger helper, mac-n-cheese, stuffing mix), pasta & pasta sauce, pancake mix & syrup, shelf-stable juice, cereal, peanut butter.
